Directive of the Chief Electoral Officer under section 4.11(2) of the *Election Act*

The purpose of this directive is to enable out of electoral division voting at advance polls and voting at special mobile polls. This directive describes the modifications to the provisions of the *Election Act* that are necessary to enable out of electoral division voting and specifies the nature and extent to which certain provisions of the *Election Act* will not be complied with. This directive is made under the Chief Electoral Officer's authority under sections 4.11(2), 4(3)(f) and 125.3 of the *Election Act*.
